POLICY: An initial orientation and training program is provided to all volunteers that is consistent with hospice industry standards.

PROCEDURES:

- 1. The initial volunteer orientation and training program for direct care volunteers is directed toward preparing volunteers to provide patient and family care. The program must be completed before a volunteer may accept a patient/family assignment.
- 2. The orientation and training program for volunteers is coordinated and supervised by the Volunteer Coordinator.
- The length of the orientation and training program is variable based on volunteer duties, but includes the following topics taught by qualified individuals (D – direct care volunteers, I – Indirect care volunteers):
 - a. introduction to the hospice philosophy of care and the patient/family as the unit of care (D,I);
 - b. role of the volunteer in hospice and the volunteer's duties and responsibilities (D,I);
 - c. confidentiality and the privacy of protected health information (D,I);
 - d. patient/family rights (D,I);
 - e. hospice in the nursing home (D);
 - f. concepts of death and dying (D, I);
 - g. grief and loss (D, I);
 - h. comfort measures (D);
 - i. communication skills (D, I);
 - j. psychosocial and spiritual issues related to death and dying (D);
 - k. signs and symptoms of approaching death and procedures following the death of a patient (D);
 - I. infection control, safety and emergency preparedness (D, I);
 - m. coping with stress (D, I);
 - n. volunteer support, educational opportunities and contact information of the Volunteer Coordinator and Director of Clinical Operations (D, I);
 - o. documentation and recordkeeping requirements (D, I); and
 - p. Specific tasks and functions as they relate to the role of the volunteer.
- 4. Documentation of the volunteer's successful completion of orientation as well as on-going inservices is retained in the volunteer's file.

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5. Volunteers are expected to, and must agree to, participate in continuing education programs as part of their on-going training.

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
