POLICY: Physical therapy (PT), occupational therapy (OT), speech-language pathology services (ST) and other therapies are provided in a manner consistent with accepted standards of practice, when necessary, for the management of symptoms related to the terminal illness.

PROCEDURE:

- 1. During the comprehensive assessment of the patient, and at any time throughout hospice care. the need for PT, OT, ST or other therapies is evaluated.
- 2. When the Interdisciplinary Group (IDG) determines that these services are needed for palliation or to help the patient reach optimal functioning, a physician's order is obtained and the services to be provided are included in the patient's plan of care.
- 3. When appropriate, referrals are made for these services and are provided by qualified individuals with whom the hospice has a written agreement.
- 4. The Director of Clinical Operations (DCO) or designee coordinates and supervises the services provided to the patient to ensure they are in accordance with the patient's plan of care.
- 5. PT, OT, ST and other therapies provided are documented in the patient's clinical record. The DCO ensures that all documentation is obtained and entered into the clinical record of care.
- 6. At the end of treatment, the therapist provides a summary of services provided and the patient's response to care.
- 7. An order to discontinue treatment is obtained from the attending or the hospice physician and documented in the patient's clinical record

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
