Physician Certification Narratives PC.P28

POLICY: The physician composes a brief narrative explanation of the clinical findings that support a life expectancy of 6 months or less as part of the certification and recertification process, in accordance with 42 CFR 418.22(b)(3).

PROCEDURE:

- 1. The narrative is located immediately prior to the physician's signature.
- 2. The physician's narrative is accompanied by an attestation statement directly above the physician's signature that confirms that the physician composed the narrative based on his/her review of the patient's medical record or, if applicable, his/her examination of the patient.
- 3. The physician's narrative reflects the patient's individual clinical circumstances and does not contain check boxes or standard language used for all patients.
- 4. When a patient is recertified for his/her third or later benefit period, the brief narrative is composed by the hospice physician who:
 - a. conducted the face-to-face encounter with the patient; or
 - b. received information regarding the face-to-face encounter from another hospice physician or the hospice nurse practitioner who conducted the face-to-face encounter with the patient.
- 5. The narrative associated with the third or later benefit period recertification, includes an explanation of how the clinical findings of the face-to-face encounter support a life expectancy of 6 months or less.
